Soft Linen Crochet Ruffle Scarf

Soft Linen

35% wool, 35% linen, 30% baby alpaca

Soft Linen is a blend of alpaca, wool and linen that combine to make a yarn, which is both soft and sturdy. Soft Linen is a smooth DK weight yarn that lends itself well to crochet. Pieces worked in Soft Linen will hold their shape, while remaining soft to the touch. This makes it a particularly good choice for accessories that will get a lot of use, like belts, shawls, scarves and mitts. Soft Linen is available in a palette of 19 refined, yet robust colors.

SIZES: One size

Finished Measurement: 55" long x 2½" wide.

MATERIALS:

Soft Linen by **Classic Elite** (35% wool, 35% wool, 30% baby alpaca; 50 gram ball = approx 137 yards)

• 2 balls 2250 Inca Gold

Crochet Hook

• One size US G/6 (4 mm)

Or size to obtain gauge.

GAUGE: 16 sts = 4" in sc. **Gauge is not critical for this design.**

CROCHET STITCHES:

ch: (chain) Wrap the yarn around the crochet hook (yarn over) and draw it through the loop on the hook to form the first chain. Rep this step as many times as instructed. (The loop on the hook is never included when counting the number of chains).

sc: (single crochet) Insert crochet hook in indicated stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop; yarn over and draw through both loops on hook.

dc: (double crochet) Yarn over hook, insert hook into indicated st, yarn over and pull up a loop; [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 2 times.

sc3tog: (single crochet 3 together) [Insert crochet hook into next st, yarn over and pull up a loop] 3 times, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

hdc: (half double crochet) Yarn over hook, insert hook into indicated stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop; yarn over and draw through all three loops on hook.

tr: (treble crochet) Yarn over hook two times, insert hook in indicated stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop; (yarn over and draw through two loops) 3 times.

sl st: (slip stitch) Insert crochet hook in the indicated stitch, yarn over and draw through both the st and the loop on the hook.

SCARF

Ch 203. Can be lengthened by adding (or shortened by subtracting) a multiple of 4 ch. Each set of 4 ch = approx 1".

Row 1: Sc into 4th ch from hook, *ch 1, sk 1 ch, sc into next ch; rep from * across—101 ch-1 sps.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc), *[dc, ch 3, dc] into next ch-1 sp; rep from * across, dc into second ch of tch, turn—101 ch-3 sps.

Row 3: Ch 3, sc into ch-3 sp, dc between the next 2 dc, *ch 7, sk 2 dc, dc between next 2 dc, sc into ch-3 sp, dc between next 2 dc; rep from * to end, turn—50 ch-7 sps.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc3tog into next [dc, sc, dc], *[sc, hdc, 2dc, 3tr, 2dc, hdc, sc] into ch-7 sp, sc3tog over dc, sc, dc; rep from * to end, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sk 2 sts, dc 3 into next st, [dc into next 3 sts, dc 3 into next st] 2 times, *sk 3 sts, dc 3 into next dc, [dc into next 3 sts, dc 3 into next st] 2 times; rep from * to end, sk 2 sts, sc into tch, turn.

Row 6: Ch 4, sl st into first dc, *sc 3, ch 4, sl st into the same dc as the last sc; rep from * to end, sc into tch. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Block to meas if desired.
